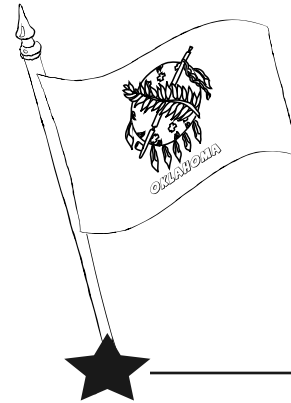
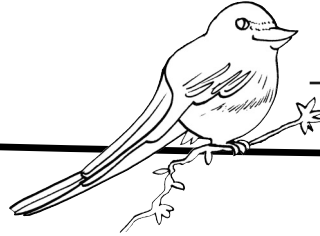
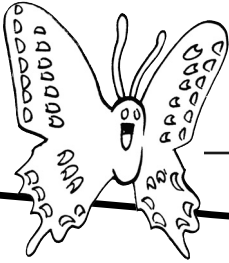


# OKLAHOMA

The state tree of Oklahoma is the redbud. Label the redbud tree.

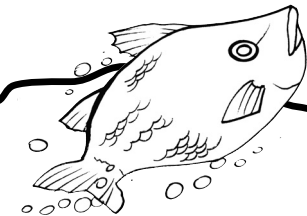
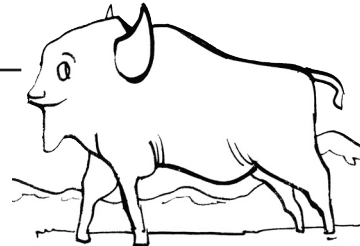
The buffalo is Oklahoma's state animal. Label the buffalo.

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# Oklahoma Facts

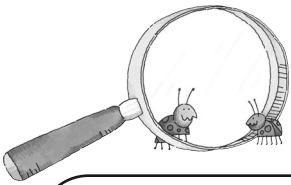
The name Oklahoma comes from the Choctaw words *okla*, for "people," and *humma*, meaning "red."

In the Wichita Mountains Wildlife Refuge near Lawton, you can see one of the largest remaining buffalo herds in the world!

Grasses grow as tall as eight feet high in the Tallgrass Prairie Preserve near Pawhuska.

With 12 official EPA ecoregions and an unofficial 13th known as "urban turf," Oklahoma offers the nation's most diverse terrain—it includes everything from sand dunes to swamps, foothills to forests, and prairies to mountains.

The temperature in Oklahoma has been as low as -27°F and as high as 120°F.

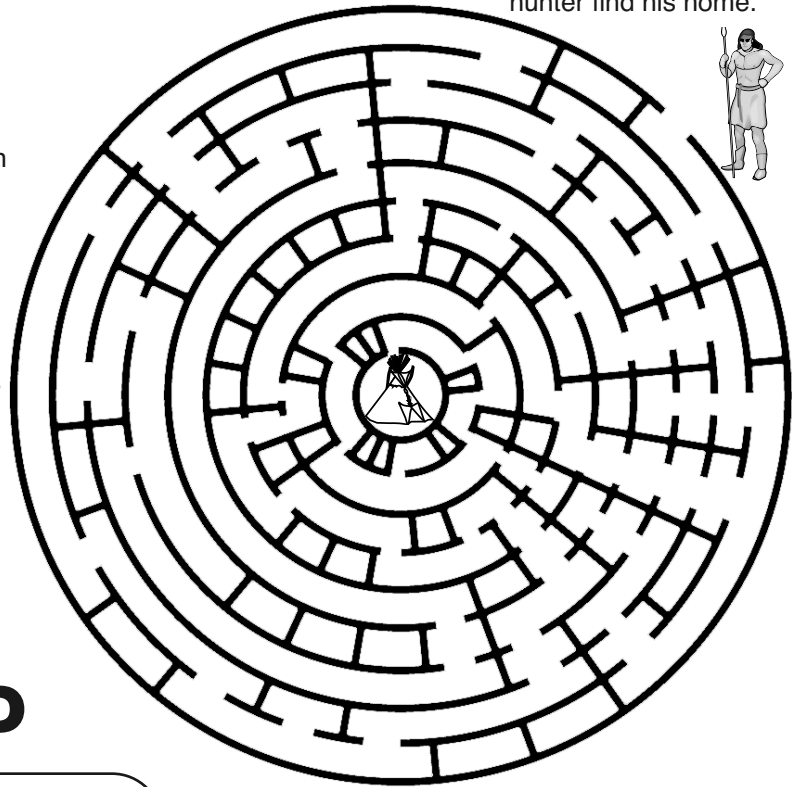
